Important Dates to Remember:

- 1. Choose an adult listener from the list at the Welcome Center (or a BSH teacher) who will listen to you quote verses and check your answers.
- 2. You must quote the entire lesson at one time. The questions in each lesson must also be completed.
- 3. You must recite the reference and verse word-forword.
- 4. You may only do one lesson per week.
- 5. The adult hearer must sign and date the bottom of each lesson as it is completed.
- 6. Turn in your completed book to the church office.

IMPORTANT: If you are learning verses for **AWANA** you may count those toward this scholarship, beginning in January 2021. You may choose which weeks to do in this booklet. Have AWANA leader sign the next page verifying the number of verses learned for AWANA. You will need to learn a total of 50 verses from January – June 6th.
